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PATTERNS OF TRADE AMONG
THE MUSLIM COUNTRIES

I. INTRODUCTION

This is an age of country-groupings and trade is considered as an important instrument of economic integration among countries. Interdependence among nations in the present day world makes economic cooperation mutually beneficial to the members of an alliance. The need for a study in depth of the structure of trade among the countries of the Muslim World vis-a-vis the rest of the world can hardly be over-emphasised.

2- The unifying force of Islam among the Muslim countries as evidenced by the world-wide gatherings of the Muslim brethren, has no parallel in the world history. Creation of the Islamic Development Bank in Jeddah under the auspices of the World Islamic Conference is a landmark in realizing the goal of unity among the Muslim countries. Needless to say, that the emergence of the Muslim Conference as an independent world body is of the greatest importance for all of us. There are 41 Muslim countries in all, with a total population of 550 million which constitutes about 14 per cent of the world total. But the Muslim countries together share only 3 per cent of the total world output and 6.6 per cent of the total world trade.

There are three distinct categories among the countries of the Muslim world as follows:

- i) Nearly half of these countries are among the poorest in the world with a per capita income lower than US\$ 250 per annum.
- ii) There are four Muslim countries which have a per capita income substantially higher than the overall world average of about US\$ 1000.
- iii) The remaining countries belong to the middle income-group whose per capita income ranges between US\$ 250 and US\$ 1000.

3- The foundation of political alliances in the modern world is generally laid on economic cooperation among its members. The scope of such alliances has varied from case to case. It can be a complete merger of the economic systems, as in the case of the countries of the European Economic Community (EEC), or a loose free trade association, as among countries of the North Atlantic (NAFTA). The latter case is an arrangement under which members eliminate tariffs on their imports of goods from one another while retaining their existing tariffs on imports from non-members. In the case of alliances like that of the EEC the members take additional steps in unifying their original national tariffs into a common tariff against the rest of the world by liberalizing internal movement of labour and capital as well as goods by means of a number of uniform economic policies. A free trade

association, on the other hand, can be a purely economic union without the ultimate objective of a political union and sparing maximum feasible political sovereignty among members of the association. This may be best suited for countries characterized by large geographical distances.

4- It is not the purpose of this paper to go into any detailed discussion of the form of feasible or desirable union among members; suffice it to mention that in a large number of the Muslim countries there can be many shades of cooperation which can be considered for an ultimate decision on the type of union among the members of the Muslim World. The possibilities of regional or sub-regional groupings will ultimately depend on the extent to which the countries can have complementarity in trade. The degree of complementarity in trade depends on the commodity composition of production in the various countries, their respective demands in their home markets and the surpluses, if any, for exporting them abroad.

II. BASIC FRAMEWORK

5- Determination of the structure of trade among member countries can thus be a first step towards exploring the basis for collaboration. There is a wide diversity in the existing patterns of trade of the Muslim countries. Statistical data relating to different aspects of various countries including those

of the Muslim World are published by the United Nations and other international agencies, but no statistical study has so far been made exclusively on the pattern of trade or the inter-relationships existing among the economies of the Muslim countries. There is, in fact, a big statistical vacuum in the international relationships among the countries of the Muslim World. Discussions of policy in a vacuum can be misleading and fruitless. The design of rational policies and of appropriate strategies requires a thorough, expert investigation.

6- The present study is, therefore, a pioneering effort at initiating the process of filling this statistical gap in order to provide a systemised basis for further investigation and at the same time identifying priority areas for statistical investigation and improvement of the existing data.

BASIC TRADE FLOW MATRICES

7- The present exercise covers 39 Muslim countries and identifies 35 of their major commodities which enter into international trade. Together these 35 commodities constitute roughly about 94.7 per cent of the total exports of the Muslim countries to the rest of the world and about 66.4 per cent of the total imports of the Muslim world. Commodity-by-commodity analysis of

the flows of each Muslim country was considered in the following preliminary trade flow matrix:

8- In the above matrix, section A consists of the intra-regional trade flows among Muslim countries; section B & C refer to the export flows from Muslim countries or group of countries to the entire developing world including Muslim countries and the rest of the World respectively. Section G contains the sum total of the export flows of individual commodities or commodity groups from the Muslim world to all the regions as under:-

$$G^k = \sum_{r=1, \dots, n} \sum_{s=1, \dots, n, n+1, n+2} F_{r,s}^k$$

In other words, total export of commodity k from countries r (r=1,.....n) to regions s refer to the rows of the export flows of individual commodities

over the three regions. Only region A comprises individual countries. The Developing World and the rest of the World are treated as consolidated single regions.

9- Import flows of individual commodities or group of commodities G' , on the other hand, are shown in columns as in section D and E as follows:-

$$G = \sum_{r=1, \dots, n, n+1, n+2} \sum_{s=1, \dots, n} F_{r,s}^k$$

10- It may be noted that the sum total of imports G' and total of exports G of the Muslim world for any single year do not necessarily balance. There may be a surplus or a deficit involved in their balance of trade. In the case of Inter-regional trade, the difference is explained by the methodology in the recording of trade data. Whereas imports are usually at c.i.f. (cost, insurance and freight) exports are valued f.o.b. (free on board).

11- Basic flow matrices have been constructed by using all available data. It may be mentioned that innumerable gaps still remain to be filled. It has not been possible, for instance, to use the same year data for trade among countries. It has been assumed that the volume and composition of imports and exports are not substantially different over a period of 2 to 3 years. In other words, it is assumed that the last year chosen

for the construction of basic matrix may be different in the case of a country or a group of countries, yet the broad composition and the aggregate volume would not have been substantially different one year before or after the base-year adopted in the present exercise. The base-year for this exercise was chosen to be the year 1973.

12- The basic matrices thus provide a broad and approximate picture of the trade flows of the Muslim vis-a-vis the Rest of the World.

13- The names of countries covered in this study and the abbreviations used against each are given in Annexure-I. It may, however, be observed that in this study only those Muslim Countries have been included who attended Lahore summit. Since then Nigeria and some other countries have shown intention to join the International Muslim Conference. The data for Nigeria has not been included in the present study, however.

III. SUMMARY FINDINGS

14- Total exports of the Muslim countries to the Rest of the World (including intra-regional trade among Muslim bloc and non-Muslim developing countries amounted to about US \$41.12 billion in the world total of about \$511.72 billion in the base year 1973). Muslim World's share in the total world exports was thus

slightly above 8 per cent. Total imports into the Muslim Countries amounted to \$29.85 billion out of the world total of some \$535.45 billion in the base year. This implies the Muslim world's share of about 6.5 per cent in the World total of imports.

15- Intra-regional balance of trade for the base-year in respect of the Muslim World shows a deficit but its balance of trade with the Developing World as a whole including Muslim countries as well as with the Rest of the World is in the surplus as shown in Table I.

Countries with Highest Share

The first five countries which have the largest share in the total trade among Muslim countries are

Lebanon, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Turkey and Iraq. As a bloc, they have a surplus in their balance of trade with respect to their intra-regional and extra-regional flows of trade.

The Next Eleven

The next Eleven Muslim countries experienced balance of trade deficits in their intra-regional trade flows. They are: Algeria, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Jordan, Kuwait, Malaysia, Morocco, Sudan, Syria and Tunisia.

The Remaining Twenty Three

The remaining twenty three Muslim countries as a bloc had a deficit in their balance of trade in their intra-regional flows and also with the developing World as a whole. However, group of countries with per capita income less than \$200 had a surplus in their total world trade.

COMMODITY RANKING

16- An attempt is made in this section of the study to identify major commodities of export of the Muslim countries and an order of ranking is then established under three alternatives as outlined in the subsequent paragraphs.

First Ranking

17- Out of the total exports of Rs. \$41.1 billion from the Muslim countries to all the three Worlds: Muslim World, Developing World and the Developed World, about 78 per cent comes from only one commodity i.e. petroleum and its products. Cotton ranks second with only 3.2 per cent in the total volume of exports. Oil seed products and fats, Textiles, fruits and vegetables get the third, fourth and fifth place respectively with 2%, 1.9% and 1.5% shares in the total

exports of the Muslim countries to the three World regions, viz., the Muslim World, the Developing World and the Rest of the World. Fifteen different commodities of exports have been identified for all the muslim countries which contribute nearly 95 per cent to the total exports of the Muslim World. Rank order of the fifteen major commodities of exports from the Muslim countries is shown in the following table.

Second Ranking

18- In the intra-regional trade of the Muslim countries, petroleum and its products still rank as the highest but with the much smaller share of 35.5 per cent in the total of exports from Muslim countries to the Muslim countries. The identified eleven commodities contributed 66.2 per cent of the total export of the Muslim countries to Muslim countries. The remainder of 33.8 per cent comprised a host of export items contributing small amounts to the total. Percentage shares of all identified commodities is shown in Table II.

19- Out of the 15 commodities of export which were identified with respect to the Muslim Countries entering World trade, only eleven were relevant for the intra-regional trade as specified in the Table II above. The remaining four had negligible shares in the intra-regional trade of the Muslim World.

Third Ranking

20- An interesting aspect of an export commodity is its shares between the muslim World and the Developing World vis-a-vis the one in all the three Worlds.

21- Each identified items of export relevant for intra-regional trade of the muslim World, is therefore, ranked further in terms of its share in the total of exports to all three worlds and its share in exports to the Developing World. An item with its shares higher in respect to both get a higher place in the ranking, as shown in table III.

IMPORTS

22- Total imports into Muslim countries from the Muslim World are estimated at \$ 1970 million which constitute only about 7% of their total world imports. Out of this total value of intra-regional imports of the Muslim World, we have identified some 22 major commodities of imports, valuing about 490 million dollars. The identified imports are thus only about one-fourth of their total intra-regional imports. This means that 75% of the imports of the Muslim World remain unidentified and cover a very large number of import items. Major items of identified imports are, listed below in table IV in order of their importance. A country-wise statement of imports showing 5 major items of import in respect of each muslim country is given in Annexure.

IV. CONCLUDING REMARKS

23- Main usefulness of the present study lies in delineating a structure of trade for the muslim countries vis-a-vis the Rest of the World. In so doing the study has specifically brogght out share of the muslim world trade in the total world trade and at the same time identified the following:-

- a) Commodity flows in respect of the major exports from the muslim world to the Rest of the world and to the 'Developing World.'
- b) Import flows of major items relating to the Muslim world from the Rest of the World and
- c) Ranking of Countries and Commodities in order to importance within the Muslim world in terms of their volume of trade.
