



Infant Mortality Rate per 1000 Live Births 1992-2015



Proportion of Children Age 12-23 (18-29) months with All-Basic **Vaccinations by Wealth Quintiles 2005-2014/5**




Age-Specific Fertility Rates, 2008, 2010 and 2014/5 Women of Childbearing Age


Comprehensive Knowledge about HIV, among Male and Female Youth Aged 15-24 Years, 2005-2014/51





Population Covered by Mutual Health Insurance (%)




Access to Safe Drinking Water 1990–2010/11 and Linear Progression





Under-5-Years Mortality Rate per 1000 Live Births 1992-29015






Percentage of Deliveries Assisted by a Skilled Worker 1992-2014/15



Proportion of Children 12-23 Months Immunised



Married Women Aged 15-49 Years Uptake of Modern Contraception, 1992-2014/15




Antenatal Care Visits 1992-2015, % at least 1 visit and 4+ **Visits**




Engage in Unsafe Sex and Used a Condom at Last Sexual Intercourse – 2000, 2005 and 2010




Pregnant Women's and Children's Use of a Treated Mosquito
