Date	Timeline event
31 December 2019	A cluster of cases of pneumonia were reported in Wuhan China which were eventually identified as a novel coronavirus.
13 January 2020	First case identified outside of China, in Thailand.
11 March	WHO characterised COVID-19 as a pandemic.
4 April	Over 1 million cases were confirmed worldwide.
18-19 May	The 73 rd World Health Assembly was the first to be held virtually and adopted a landmark resolution to bring the world together to fight the pandemic.
15 July	The COVAX facility secured engagement from more than 150 countries worldwide.
23 November	AstraZeneca and Oxford University report their vaccine candidate has at least 61% efficacy, which found their

	formulations halted symptoms in up to 95% of trial participants.
